Music Workshop Theme 2012: Lift Up Your Heads

The theme of Music Workshop in 2012 is *Lift Up Your Heads*. It comes from the ending verses of the twenty fourth Psalm which prophesies of the triumphal King Jesus and his entry into Jerusalem. The 24th Psalm speaks of the glory of Jesus and declares Him to be the King of Glory and Lord of Hosts. This psalm has prophetic elements that involve both his first and second advents and it gives instructions for the saints living in all ages. It is the desire of the Workshop to spend the week contemplating the glory of the Lord. We intend to heed the call of the scripture and lift up our heads and behold the Lamb of God which has taken the away the sin of the world.

The three subheadings of the theme involve three depictions of the Lord in Psalm 24. Why were the heads to be lifted up? What manner of person was this Lord? Why was He so worthy of praise? We will focus on three attributes of our Lord in the three days of worship

Day One: The Lord of All Creation Psalm 24:1-2

Psalm 24 begins by declaring that the earth and all its inhabitants belong to the Lord. The miracles of Christ show his dominion over all creation. The winds of the waves heard His voice. The ass was ready to be ridden into Jerusalem with the simple instruction: the Lord hath need of him. Day one's focus is on the Lordship that Christ over us because we are his workmanship.

Day Two: The Lord of The House of Worship Psalm 24:3-6.

The focus of day two is on the commitment to purity we are to have because of our relationship to the Lord. The individual believer and the entire body of believers are both referred to in the New Testament as being temples. Day Two we focus on the biblical commend to sanctify ourselves to participate in the activities of the house of God. Jesus twice in his public ministry cleansed the temple with a jealous regard that it was the house of God and therefore should be pure. John the Baptist lets us know that there is an expected fruit that is *meet for repentance*.

Day Three: The King of Glory and Lord of Hosts Psalm 24:7-10

The focus of the final day is one of triumph. We focus of the King of all kings and Lord of all Lords. We are to join with the ancient dwellers of Jerusalem and sing our hosannas as we acknowledge Christ of the King of Glory.

Scriptures for possible use each day

DAY 1: Lord of All Creation

For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills. I know all the fowls of the mountains: and the wild beasts of the field are mine. If I were hungry, I would not tell thee: for the world is mine, and the fulness thereof. Psalms 50:10-12

And now, Israel, what doth the LORD thy God require of thee, but to fear the LORD thy God, to walk in all his ways, and to love him, and to serve the LORD thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul, To keep the commandments of the LORD, and his statutes, which I command thee this day for thy good? DAY 2: Lord of the House of Worship

DAY 3: King of Glory

For thus saith the LORD of hosts; Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land; And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the LORD of hosts. The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, saith the LORD of hosts. The glory of this latter house shall be greater than of the former, saith the LORD of hosts: and in this place will I give peace, saith the LORD of hosts. Haggai 2:6-9
