
Choir Rehearsal

After the service, we will take a quick break before continuing a very busy day of choral instruction, choir rehearsals and a special "Snack and Chat"

time, where attendees have the opportunity to discuss pertinent topics with each other regarding participation in church music.

Wednesday evening's activity will begin at 7:30 in the sanctuary. We are very excited about a special program which will be presented by the Lanes Primitive

Baptist choir and members of the Statesboro Primitive Baptist choir entitled **"The Body of Christ."** This cantata by Pepper Choplin, and directed by Brother Wade McElveen, is a beautiful piece with narration that expresses a theme representing many things throughout Scripture. There is the literal, physical body of Christ – the body that was sacrificed on our behalf to save us from sin. There is the body explained by Jesus to the disciples in the Upper Room – the body represented by the bread and wine. Finally, the Body of Christ that is manifested in the Church – the body of His work, multiplied in those who follow Him. On Thursday, we begin the day with Morning Meditation at 9:00. We will follow that with choir rehearsal in final preparation for the Sacred Concert on Thursday afternoon.

JOYSHOP (Ages 3 – 12)



Covid Protocol at Music Workshop 2021

For months now, a recurring conversation at Music Workshop Board Meetings has been about Covid and Music Workshop. Fortunately, some things have changed in our favor: a Covid vaccine, a decline in numbers, and the knowledge for treatment. Of course, the need to do our part as individuals is as great as ever. We cannot take Covid for granted because we do not want to go back. The following comments concern our protocol at Music Workshop this year.

First of all, it seemed necessary to do two things: 1) shorten Workshop and 2) find a place that offered us the security we needed. We were able to do both of those things. That is why we are having an abbreviated Workshop, and we are meeting at Statesboro Primitive Baptist Church. Statesboro Church is the perfect place for us to meet this year, and we are thankful that they so graciously said yes to our request. Hopefully,

those two things will prevent a multitude of problems.

As you probably know, the state of Georgia is no longer under a mask mandate. Masks are very personal. Some people never wore them during the whole time, and others never took them off. With that thought in mind, we have decided not to require masks at Music Workshop. Now, we are not requiring them, but you are welcome to wear them as much as you would like. Please bring a good mask as decisions about masks and singing will be made a little closer to the time. The sanctuary at Statesboro Church is really big and will lend itself to the opportunity to spread out. That might take care of any concerns we have.

We will provide hand sanitizer and gloves when needed. We do encourage you to wash your hands every chance you get. We also feel this might not be the time to hug and kiss everyone you see. It would be a good idea to keep a distance between yourself and others. A little reserve might be proper at this point.

If there is any chance that you have been exposed or if you are presenting symptoms that are suspicious, please do not attend Music Workshop this year. You will be missed, but you will know that you did everything you could do to protect yourself and others.

Consider this quote by Warren Wiersbe: "The safest place in all the world is in the will of God, and the safest protection in all the world is the name of God."

Please help us get this Workshop right by praying for us. Please hold up the name of Music Workshop when you pray. We thank you for your support.

WELCOME BACK! WELCOME BACK!! WELCOME BACK!!

It seems like Music Workshop 2019 was a century ago! The last months have been so challenging. Things have happened to each and every one of us that have been so difficult, so hurtful, so defeating. BUT there is light at the end of the tunnel. We can only thank our God for his sustaining grace in bringing us through these hard times and staying close to each of us when we did not even know it. Our God is a GREAT God!

Today, I would like to think about the two little words *welcome back*. They may be small, but they are powerful. I have been thinking about just what those words mean, and I would like to share my thoughts.

1) *Welcome Back* means that someone went somewhere. Now, for most of us, it means we went home. There is comfort in going home because home is a safe and secure place, a place where we did not have to worry about what was going on outside. Home was a refuge. But we have an even greater refuge in our God: "Be merciful unto me, O God, be merciful unto me: for my soul trusteth in thee: yea, in the shadow of thy wings will I make my refuge, until these calamities be overpast" (Psalm 57:1). Yes, we went somewhere, and thank goodness, God was there.

2) *Welcome Back* means there is a motivation to return. Sometimes we become very comfortable in our security. We become so comfortable that we almost become "stuck" in our surroundings. Covid-19 did that to so many of us. However, there is a whole world out there, and God would have us be a part of it. "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10). We are so thankful that your feet may lead you back to us. Music Workshop 2021 is a motivation to get out of your comfort zone. (The Workshop Board is even dealing with this).

3) *Welcome Back* means someone is glad to see you return. In this case, it is the Music Workshop!!! We missed you last year: the worship, the prayer, the singing, the fellowship, and so much more. It is such a blessing to have the opportunity to return to all those things. "Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you" (James 4:8). We are not crazy; you do not have to come to Music Workshop to be close to God. But it is such a wonderful experience when people of like minds meet, and God is in their midst. Those times are truly uplifting and fulfilling. Please return to Music Workshop. Together, we will enter into His courts with thanksgiving.
