The Primitive Baptist Music Workshop is pleased to announce that the 60<sup>th</sup> Annual Music Workshop will be held this summer at Camp Hillview near Metter, GA. Our conference begins Tuesday, July 19, with registration starting at 4:00PM and will run through Friday evening, July 22, ending with our Sacred Concert at Metter Primitive Baptist Church. Come celebrate this milestone with us!!

After a Covid cancelled Workshop in 2020 and an abbreviated two day meeting last year, we are very excited to be able to resume our full Music Workshop schedule this July. Elder De Hagan, pastor of Fellowship Primitive Baptist Church, has accepted our invitation to preach at each of our daily worship services. The tasks of worship and spreading the gospel in song are a lifetime commitment of the child of God. In three days of worship at this year's Workshop, we will study this commitment.

The three messages of our worship services address these aspects of our theme. On Wednesday morning, our focus will be *God's Mercies and Faithfulness In All Generations*. On Thursday, *Our Lifelong Commitment to Our Merciful God* will outline our theme text as it applies in our lives today. Finally, on Friday, *Music Ministry With Generational Awareness* explores our responsibility to address all ages in our worship music; "...the father to the children shall make known thy truth." (Isaiah 38:19) We pray that the Lord will bless Brother De as he prepares to bring us these messages.

## **REGISTRATION MADE EASY!**

This year, the Workshop has tried to make the pre-registration process a little easier. If you have attended Workshop

## THE DAILY SCHEDULE

As always, this year's schedule will be a busy one! We begin each day with breakfast at 8:00AM, followed by Morning Meditation at 8:50. On Wednesday and Friday, the schedule continues with **Master Classes** for all delegates.

These will consist of two parts: Part 1 is *Special Music for the Churches*, which addresses the challenges a smaller church with limited resources of musicians and singers may often face. Sister Dee Dee Phillips and Brother Wade McElveen will lead these seminars. Part 2 of each of the Master Classes will be led by Brother Josh Devane, who will instruct us in Vocal Training and the proper way to use the voice in general and in preparation for the hours of choir rehearsal we will encounter during the week. We are thankful for these leaders and the important value of their considerable experience.



On Wednesday and Thursday, you'll have three opportunities to *Choose-A-Class.* Beginning Guitar, Instruments/ Advanced Guitar, Congregational Song Leading/Leadership, Sight Singing/Theory and Practice Makes Perfect are all available to the delegates. Give some serious thought to what might be most helpful or interesting for you and sign up! Whether you're the Music Director at your church, or a member of the congregation who loves to sing praises to the Lord, all classes are designed to leave you with something you can use to help support the music ministry in your church.

Each day at 11:50 we will convene in Hillview's auditorium for our worship service. We take a break from music education and choir rehearsals to worship. Our Worship Committee has drawn on the many resources Workshoppers have to offer to plan these services so that every song sung and every word spoken point to the preached Word of God. Please pray that these efforts will honor and glorify His Name.

### **EVENING ACTIVITIES**

When busy days are done, there is still much to do at Workshop. Each evening offers the opportunity to participate in special programs and activities. We are excited about this year's lineup and pray that God will bless these services and programs.

Praising Our Deliverer

On Tuesday, after Registration and dinner, we begin the week in keeping with our theme. "Praising Our Deliverer to All Generations" is a service of special music, congregational singing, hymn stories and testimonials which includes sacred music from many generations. Come ready to sing and worship the Lord!





On Wednesday night, we have a special treat in store. Jubal Ministries, formerly a part of the Georgia Baptist Convention, will present a concert for Music Workshop. It will be held at the Statesboro Primitive Baptist Church and will include two of Jubal's musical groups: Jubal Brass, a thirty piece brass orchestra and Jubal Bells, a handbell choir. These groups are part of a broader and wonderful music ministry, which proclaims the Word with music throughout the country and internationally. Jubal never charges admission to their concerts, but a love offering will be taken to help support their ministry.



We will take our traditional brief break from sacred music on Thursday evening. However, we will celebrate the gifts God has given us with *Workshop's Got Talent!* This will be a night of fun and competition. Groups and individuals are strongly encouraged to prepare to present a talent act of some type. It can be a song, a comedy skit, a humorous storytelling, playing an instrument, a juggling act. As we look back at wonderful memories in our first 60 years of Music Workshop, it occurs to us that one of them took place even before the first Workshop. In the spring of 1963, the Primitive Baptist Preachers' Wives Organization gathered for their annual meeting. This group of our denomination's pastors' wives met each year for a couple of days of Bible study, fellowship and discussions centered around how they might develop better ways to support their husbands' ministries.

At this meeting, one of the topics was Music Ministry. Many of these women were already involved in their churches' music programs as pianists/organists, choir directors, choir members, etc. Their discussion focused on better ways to enhance their efforts, and those of others, in this area. From this seed, the idea of a training seminar for directors, musicians, singers, youth leaders and others in the skills of music and worship planning was born. Its growth was rapid and in August of that year the first Music Workshop was held at the Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church. The enthusiasm was intense and plans for the second annual meeting soon began.

In those early years, and for many after that, each Workshop was supported by the attendance of many of our pastors. Some were musicians, themselves, others saw the benefits working together with their church's music leaders and still others just enjoyed the fellowship and worship with the delegates from around the denomination. Today, still, we have several ministers who attend the Workshop on a regular basis, though perhaps not as many as in the past.

We want to encourage our ministers to join us at Workshop this year. We certainly understand that your duties and schedules are demanding. With those and other responsibilities, adding another meeting to the summer schedule, we know, is not easy. However, we want you to know we desire your participation. If you're not able to join us for our full time together, consider visiting with us for just a day or an afternoon. Our focus is to ensure that every aspect of our worship music, from Prelude to Closing Hymn, points to the preached Word of God. We would appreciate your input. Hope to see you there!

# Joy Shop



# MUSIC EDUCATION Classes Offered at Workshop 2022

The Scheduling Committee for Music Workshop 2022 has been hard at work. We strive to offer well-rounded music classes for all participants. Our hope is that each person will enjoy the classes and learn something of value to use in his home church. Most Music Workshop participants are a part of the music ministry of their home churches. In the end, our goal is to serve the Lord in our home churches in such a way that brings Him honor and glory.

This year, there will be two Master Classes, each divided into two thirty-minute sections. These classes will be geared to our churches that may be experiencing challenges either in available musicians or singers. We also want everyone to be grounded in the foundations of music, both in understanding the lyrics of the music, as well as the theory (notes, timing, etc). The first Master Class will be on Wednesday morning at 9:00 and the second on Friday morning, also at 9:00. Brother Wade McElveen and Sister Dee Dee Phillips will be leading those classes. They will explain how they meet the challenges in their specific churches and will share a piece of music that they used successfully in their own churches. They will share how they found it, what made it work and how they resolved challenges they faced. Music Workshop participants will then sing the music presented by the leaders. The second half of each Master Class will be conducted by Brother Josh DeVane. He will lead us in voice training to prepare our voices for the practice of our concert pieces.

As usual, we will offer several Choose-a-Class opportunities:

- 1) Instrument / Advanced Guitar Bring your instrument with you! Sister Tina Bennett and Brother David Summerford will lead the class in a small orchestra setting as members learn to play music along with a variety of other instruments.
- 2) Congregational Song Leadership Brother Thang Khai will lead this class. You will learn how to beat patterns, how to introduce hymns and other types of music, as well as how to encourage church participation. A class member will be chosen to lead the congregation in a hymn (practiced in the class) at the Sacred Concert.
- 3) Sight Singing This class will be led by Sister Helen Adams. With decades of background in music education, she will help you master the basics of reading the music in "Helen" style which is quite fun.
- 4) Beginning Guitar This class will be led by Sister Elizabeth Kasper of Brooklet Primitive Baptist Church. She will be teaching the basics of guitar playing and answering your questions as a beginner. Please bring your guitar to this class.
- 5) Practice Makes Perfect This has been a popular class for several years. Brother Josh DeVane will use class time to go over the harder parts of the concert pieces to make it easier for you to follow as you praise God.

We are excited to have some new classes and teachers. We also are praying that you will come ready to learn more about music to strengthen our worship to God in our churches.

## Letter from the Chairman

"To All Generations":

I was sitting here taking a stroll down Memory Lane, and the "generations" of my own life became very apparent to me. Please allow me to share with you.

I was brought up in a small Primitive Baptist Church in Aline, Ga: Mount Olive Primitive Baptist Church. I have random and incomplete memories, but all

of them are very special to me. I remember attending Sunday School (as we called it at that time), and no matter how many children were there on a Sunday, each one picked out a hymn and led the congregation. Mr. Gordon Morgan made sure everyone was included. I also remember participating in Christmas programs directed by my mother, and I did not always get to be an angel. Oh my goodness, the patience she had. I remember Easter egg

hunts, dinner on the grounds, sings (people came from neighboring churches everywhere), baptism at the river, Vacation Bible School, and the list goes on and on. I imagine most of you have memories very much like mine.



Then, in 1972, I married Glyn Thrift at Mount Olive Primitive Baptist Church. I remember that the church got its first AC system just before we got married. I don't think it helped as I could see the water dripping off Elder T. Roe Scott's face, and I thought Glyn would just drown. We attended Mt. Olive and Evergreen Baptist Church part time for a while and then settled in Mt. Olive. In 1980, we were blessed to bring Kyle Thrift into the world, and I turned into my mother, taking her place in many of the responsibilities she bore at Mt. Olive. In 1981, I attended my first Mu-

sic Workshop. I really think it changed my life completely. At some point, I became the pianist at Mt. Olive and even started a small choir. Some Sundays, there were more in the choir than the congregation, but it was ok: we were serving the Lord together. As you can see, this was a new generation for me. Probably, many of you can say the same thing.

In 1993, my little family began attending Metter Primitive Baptist Church. It was a much bigger church with many more activities. This was a very difficult move, but it was one that our family needed, and we felt God provided for us. I never ever lost my love for Mt. Olive Primitive Baptist Church—so much growing, so much love, so much everything! But this was my new generation. Things were different. There was so much to do, and we did it all. We felt welcomed and loved. Besides working with the youth, I became the choir director at some point. I never have felt capable of this job, but I have enjoyed it so much. I love my choir! They come, we sing, we laugh, and we start over. Then, I became the church pianist. Thank goodness, Andy Bowen married Sherrie Spier. Andy became the song leader, I moved over to the organ, and Sherrie became the pianist.



Life is good, and God has been so good to us. I am sure He has been good to you as well.

So, that brings me to today. Things are a little different. I don't get around as quickly as I once did. I can't decide whether to put my glasses on or take them off. I have to listen carefully when someone is talking. I take a lot of notes and write things down. Thank goodness I have a Smart Phone. I try to keep the calendar up to date and set the alarm to remind me about things. I even have an app that reminds me to take my medicine. I have reached a new generation. It is good because I have reached it with many of my friends and loved ones. We share memories and make new ones. This generation is different than any other. However, I am thankful! God is good. At least some of you know what I am talking about.

I suppose I should call these stages of life; however, this is how generations work. As one moves on, a new one comes along. "I will sing of the mercies of the Lord for ever: with my mouth will I make known thy faithfulness to all generations" (Psalm 89:1).

It doesn't matter which generation you are—The Greatest Generation, Baby Boomers, Millennials, or Gen Alphas (ages 1-9)—we need to keep on singing! We need to keep sharing the goodness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It doesn't matter which generation you are, there is a work to do. God has a plan for you, and He is faithful to all of us.

# So... what do I need to take with me to Music Workshop?

Music Workshop is for adults AND children. It is a little strange to say, "Pack for camp." However, that is the truth! Since we meet at Camp Hillview, you will need to bring pillows, sheets, and towels for the week, as well as your own personal toilet-

ries. You may like to include a pair of flip-flops for the showers and for walking to the pool and back. Of course, July is a pretty hot time of year in Southeast Georgia. We do allow shorts, but ask that you wear longer shorts (no short-shorts or gym shorts, PLEASE)!
