MUSIC WORKSHOP 2018



The 56th annual Primitive Baptist Music Workshop, the conference of musicians, worship leaders, choir members and directors and many who just love congregational singing and music in worship, will convene Tuesday, July 17, at Camp Hillview near Metter, GA, with registration beginning at 4:30. The workshop runs through Friday evening, July 20, ending with our Sacred Concert, held at Metter Primitive Baptist Church at 8:00pm.

Since 1963, the Music Workshop has been dedicated to the development of musicians and other leadership roles within our churches. In March of that year, the Primitive Baptist Preachers' Wives Organization held their annual meeting. The agenda included a discussion of how they might contribute more in the support of the worship services in their local churches. Some in attendance were involved in their churches' music programs. It was agreed that a need existed for more and better training in worship music and planning, which led to the concept of a seminar that would provide that opportunity for those interested in enhancing their efforts in this area of ministry. Within just a few months, the seminar was designed, planned and scheduled. In August of that same year, delegates from various churches attended the first Music Workshop, held at the Atlanta Primitive Baptist Church. For years, the Workshop was hosted each summer by one of our churches, with attendees invited to stay in the homes of that church's members. However, attendance grew rapidly and eventually Workshop was moved to Camp Hillview to accommodate the growing numbers of those attending. Along with this growth, the Lord has continually blessed our efforts with spiritual growth and a compelling, sweet fellowship that brings us back each year to hear His Word preached and explore ways to enhance our efforts to worship His Holy Name.

This year, we look forward to another wonderful week together as we focus on the true importance of the great hymns we love to sing. Our theme will be "Sermons In Song." Elder David Summerford will preach the Word at each of our midday worship services and has developed this theme to acknowledge that the singing of hymns, psalms and spiritual songs is meant to be a teaching tool of the church of Jesus Christ. In these three messages, Brother David will explore the Bible's instructions to teach the doctrines of the church through song, the purpose of the birth and death of Jesus Christ and the purpose of the church.

On Wednesday, we explore the question, "What kind of song did David's choir sing?" This examination of some of our favorite songs and hymns, which are truly sermons in song, will encourage a process of searching the lyrics of our songs and finding the Bible verses upon which those lyrics are based. Thursday's message, "Born To Die", focuses on the birth and death of our Lord, Jesus Christ and points to the fact that some of our seasonal favorites, the songs of Christmas and Easter, include some of the strongest doctrinal truths of any of our music. Finally, on Friday, in "The Church Victorious," Brother David will address songs that show the purpose of the church and the final victory of the church triumphant.

We are so thankful for Brother David and his countless contributions to Music Workshop over the decades as a long time Board member, minister, musician, instructor and versatile entertainer during the humorous and fun times we enjoy each year! He and his wife, Carolyn, also a member of our Board, have been such a blessing to the Workshop and our denomination, and we thank them for their faithful service. Please pray the Lord's blessings on Brother David as he prepares to preach on these rich themes in our worship services.

As always, each day at Workshop is a full schedule! We begin with breakfast at 8:00 and continue with morning meditations, a wide range of instruction classes and small group discussions, prayer groups, worship services, choir practices and a lot of fun and fellowship. In addition to our fast paced agenda, there is a wide range of classes and instruction to choose from that offers opportunities to enhance existing skills, or begin a new course of study in an area you've never tried before. Be sure to see the Choose-A-Class article on page 3. Many of our attendees are not necessarily able to join us for the full week, but may come for just a day or two. We invite you to join us too, for whatever time you can. We know you'll enjoy and be blessed!

If our daytime schedule is not a possibility for you, consider attending our evening activities. Each night offers a special program. On Tuesday, after dinner, we'll meet in Camp Hillview's auditorium for plenty of singing and an introduction to the week's theme, with presentations of some of our best loved hymns and their composers. As part of the program, we'll have a special presentation you won't want to miss! Just trust us on this one – that's all we can say.

Wednesday night, the Metter Church, along with members of a few area churches, will present "A Picture of Calvary," music and drama telling the stories of some who followed Him throughout His three year ministry and others who were with Him at the cross. These stories are the world's most compelling, as we all know. This program will bring to us a vivid picture of Calvary and its impact on those closest to our Lord during His time here with us. This program will be held at Metter Primitive Baptist Church at 8:00pm.

On Thursday, Talent Night offers everyone an opportunity to present their musical, dramatic or comedic talent to the group. We encourage EVERYONE to choose or create an act, put together a costume and props, if you like, and start rehearsing!! This should be a LOTTA fun! Oh, and one more thing: Please send us a quick email and tell us about your plans! Give us a brief description of what you plan to do, the name of your act, names of any others included in the act and whether you may need any assistance with accompaniment or other support. Please send your information to markalansimms@gmail.com. For those who may need assistance, the deadline for submitting that request is July 1. For others, please have your information to us by July 10. A distinguished panel of judges will choose the top 3 contestants, whose lives, we're sure, will be forever changed!

Friday night, of course is our Sacred Concert, featuring the Workshop Choir of nearly 100 voices. It's been our tradition to close the week with this inspiring musical worship service, which is the culmination of much hard work throughout the week. Our concert committee has spent many hours planning this night and selecting a wide range of powerful sacred music for the week's finale. Also a tradition will be the presentation of this year's Nancy Patton Scholarship winner(s). The concert will also be held at Metter Church at 8:00pm.

We hope you'll consider Workshop for your summer calendar this year! It's a wonderful experience of worship, work, music and fellowship, even if you're only able to spend a few hours with us. CHOOSE-A-CLASS OPTIONS AT WORKSHOP


Music Workshop is excited to announce the Choose-a-Class sessions for this year. We continue to have many popular offerings. We encourage you to give serious thought to those class options you may want to attend. Morning and afternoon offerings are outlined below to help in making your selections.

Sister Lisa Lamb will be with us again for the *Signing* class. Members of this class will learn sign language for a couple of songs which they can take home and use in their own churches.





Sister Tina Bennett will teach the *Instrument* class. This class is always a mix of instruments and ages.







You will have a chance to take an extra look at the concert music in *Practice makes Perfect*, taught by Sister Kathy McCoy.

We are bringing back *Voice* class; it will be led by Brother Josh Devane, who has been performing in musical stage productions all over the United States. He will also present the Friday *Voice* class for the entire Workshop, explaining how to sing with a tired voice.
